- Our Stay in Italy: I always recommend that you give yourself AT LEAST one full day on either end of your trip in case of flight delays etc. Besides, you are in ITALY! You might as well see some other sights while you are there. Our shuttle will pick up in Florence on the day our trip begins, it is a courtesy to our guests so if you miss the pickup or choose not to take it, we can suggest private car service that will get you to our location.

- What's the deposit? The deposit is \$800 and is non-refundable
- What is the rooming situation?
